The Ludden Lecture was established in 1986 to honor Franklin M. Ludden, Professor and former chairperson of the Department of History of Art, who passed away in 2002. The lectures are intended to reflect an interdisciplinary approach to the study of Art History with an emphasis on theory, and/or criticism. The lecturers are selected by a committee representing the disciplines of History of Art, English, Romance Languages, Philosophy, and Medieval and Renaissance Studies. Previous Ludden Lecturers have included: Norman Bryson, Svetlana Alpers, W.J.T. Mitchell, Keith Moxey, Joseph Koerner, Michael Fried, Michael Ann Holly, David Rosand, and Georges Didi-Huberman.
